Mission Peak Chamber Singers is hiring!

Mission Peak Chamber Singers is a non-profit community choir organization based in Fremont. We consist of two ensembles, the Chamber Singers and the People's Choir. We rehearse together once a week, and present three formal performances a year, along with multiple informal appearances throughout the greater Fremont community. The choral ensemble is seeking an accomplished collaborative pianist to join our artistic director, Dr. Corie Brown, and our choirs for the 2024-25 Season and beyond. We also have a managing director and dedicated volunteer Board of Directors. This is a salaried part-time position.

General Requirements

- 1. Collaborative experience with choirs
- 2. Excellent communication skills with artistic staff, singers, and Board of Directors
- 3. Flexibility with a wide range of styles, genres, and modalities, including rote rehearsing and improvisation, is ideal

Responsibilities of the Collaborative Pianist

The Collaborative Pianist shall work for the betterment of MPCS and specifically perform the following tasks:

- 1. Accompany rehearsals on a piano, organ, or electric keyboard in preparation for MPCS concerts. Rehearsals are scheduled for Tuesday evenings from 7:00 p.m. until 9:30 p.m., or as agreed upon. Extra rehearsals may be added, and the Collaborative Pianist will be given advance notice of these rehearsals.
- 2. Prepare and accompany all regular and special performances. The Artistic Director and BOD will determine the number of performances and concerts that will be accompanied. A performance shall include any pre-rehearsal, warm-up and/or call time on the performance day as required by the Artistic Director.
- 3. The Collaborative Pianist shall work directly and in cooperation with the Artistic Director in planning rehearsals, repertoire, concerts, scheduling, and other logistical matters.
- 4. The Collaborative Pianist shall attend BOD meetings when requested.
- 5. The Collaborative Pianist shall give sufficient notice, typically 24 hours, to the Artistic Director and a designated BOD member in cases of emergency or illness. The Collaborative Pianist shall

assist in the finding of a substitute as needed for such occasions. After two absences accrued during the contract period, the Collaborative Pianist will be responsible for the substitute's compensation.

Term and Salary

The Collaborative Pianist shall receive a salary of \$5,000.00 (\$555.56 per month) for the 2024-2025 concert season, to be paid in monthly installments by arrangement, subject to state and federal taxes. The contract will cover a nine-month period, September 1-May 31.

To apply:

Mission Peak welcomes and uplifts those applicants who are representative of our greater values and our diverse community, including applicants from historically minoritized communities. We encourage all applicants, especially anyone with unique perspectives or diverse voices to apply. Applications are reviewed on a rolling deadline.
